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FRENCH SILK PIE

By: Family recipe
Servings: 8
Prep time: 25 minutes
Total time: 4.5 hours

INGREDIENTS

- ¾ cup butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 Tablespoon vanilla extract
- 3 ounces unsweetened chocolate, chopped and melted
- 3 eggs
- 9" pie crust of your choosing (pastry is traditional, graham is my favourite, chocolate graham or wafer is next level decadence)
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- Milk chocolate bar for curling or grating (a vegetable peeler works well for curling but grating is quick and easy)

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cream room temperature butter and sugar. Add vanilla and melted chocolate. When fully incorporated, add eggs one at a time mixing for 5 minutes after each egg.
2. Pour into the pie crust of your choice and let set in the refrigerator for at least 4 hours.
3. Whip the cream with the powdered sugar on high for about 2 minutes or until soft peaks form. Spoon on top of the chilled pie and garnish with the chocolate curls/shavings.

An Invisible Thread by Alex Tresniowski & Laura Schroff

The true story of an 11-year-old panhandler, a busy sales executive and an unlikely meeting with destiny.

New Yorkers are accustomed to being asked for spare change. In September 1986 Laura Schroff was, but she kept on walking. Then seeing it was a hungry boy, sticks for arms and ratty clothing, she walked back to him. Maurice. She bought him lunch at McDonald's. After that day she became his lifeline. They became lifelong friends.

Maurice's home was a drug den, dealers in and out. Addictions. Jail terms. He does not tell Laura everything. Nor does she tell him. From a normal middle-class home, hers was disrupted nightly by her violently abusive father. What was the invisible thread that factored into Laura's love for Maurice and

her commitment to him? From his ages 11-15 they met every Monday for a meal at restaurants or in her apartment. But so much more. Among many other things she introduced him to her sister's beautiful family. There he saw what a healthy family looked like. Today he is able to love and support his own in ways that he never experienced himself.

An Invisible Thread released in November 2011 has since also been turned into a children's book and is in schools as a teaching for kindness. Angels on Earth, her follow-up book is comprised of stories Schroff has collected from others whose lives have also been touched by invisible threads.

The Elegance of the Hedgehog by Muriel Barbery

A literary piece at its best, it is profound, satirical, beautiful. Every chapter gives a message. Like a mini-essay, philosophical, to be chewed slowly, not swallowed all at once.

Renée, 54, live-in concierge, is employed by the posh Parisian wealthy of 7, Rue de Grenelle. Paloma, 12, is the very bright daughter in one of those elite families. Both are unusually intelligent but can't let others know that. How is it that Renée, a concierge, knows Tolstoy, Marx, and Vermeer: Anna Karenina, class struggle, Dutch painting. Regarding literature her take is that its: "mission is to make fulfillment of our essential duties more bearable". And how is it that a 12-year-old understands the world better than her peers. In her diary Paloma writes: "Like bees we are here to live, eat, reproduce and die. People are so arrogant thinking they can coerce nature and escape their destiny." So as not to upset those around them, both Renée and Paloma work very hard at being invisible.

But then one day, BAM! Everything changes in this forever unchanging upscale complex. Are the true Renée and Paloma suddenly being found out?

Muriel Barbery is a philosophy professor. Her husband/co-author, Stephané, is a sociologist. Accordingly, they philosophize about many topics including social class. Written in French, it has been translated to English and is a New York Times best seller.

5-STAR QUALITIES: Clever main character, fun mid-story twist, engaging from start to finish.



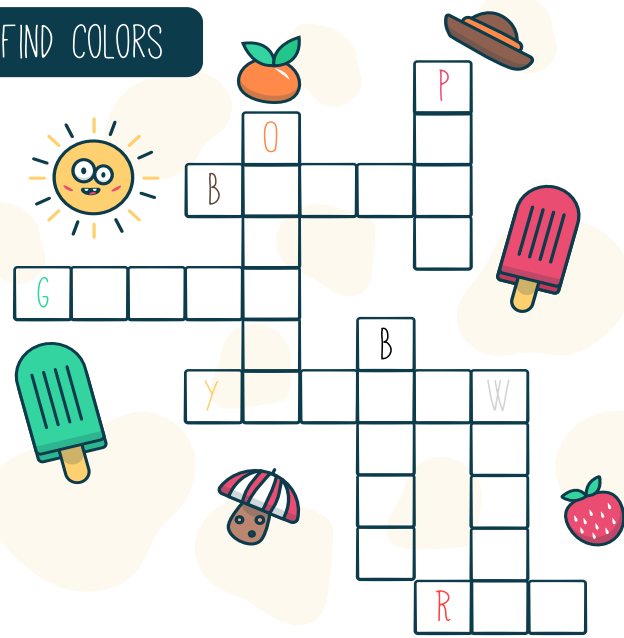
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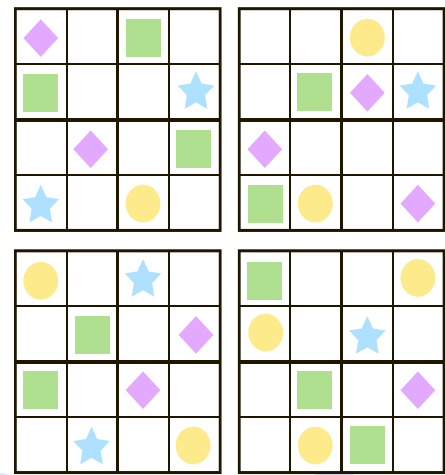
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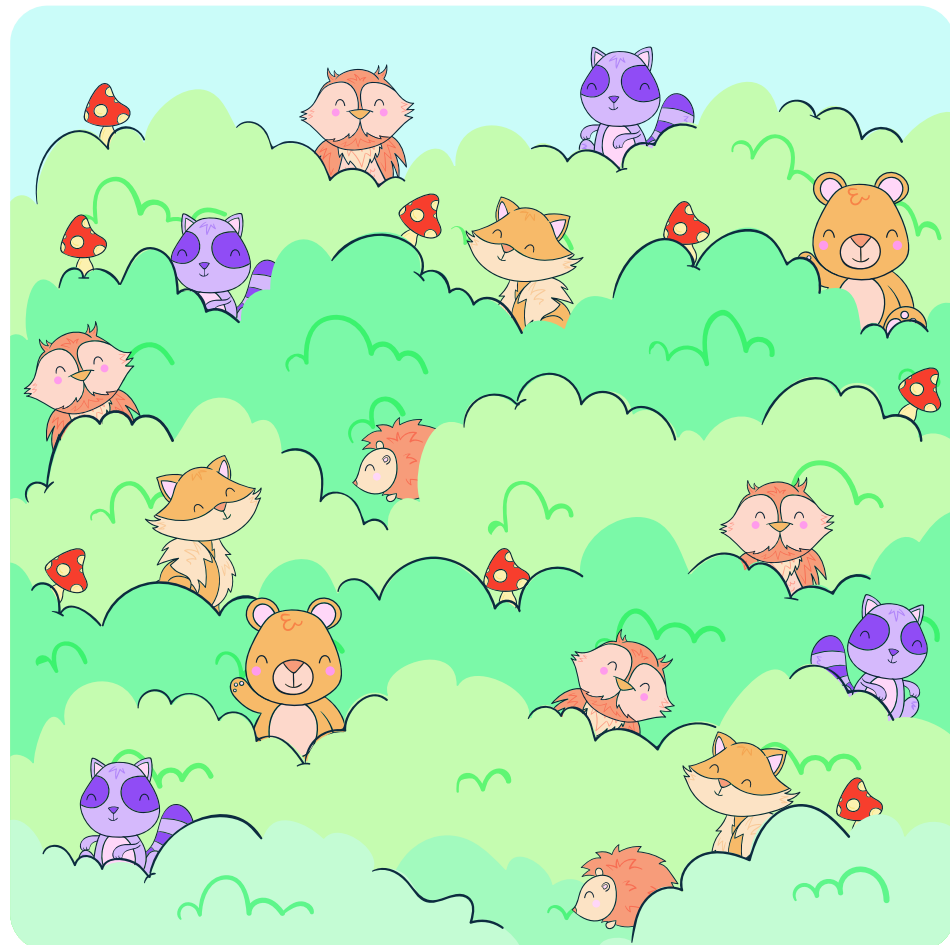

This Tender Land by William Kent Kruger

William Kent Krueger's *This Tender Land* is a beautiful, heartfelt tale of survival, friendship, and the search for home. Set against the backdrop of the Great Depression, it follows four orphaned children—brothers Odie and Albert, their mute Sioux friend Mose, and Emmy, a young girl with a mysterious gift—as they flee the harsh and oppressive Lincoln Indian Training School. Forced to escape after a tragic turn of events, the group embarks on a daring journey down the Mississippi River in a stolen canoe, hoping to one day reach an estranged family member in St. Louis and find a place where they can truly call home.

Krueger masterfully weaves together literary fiction, adventure, mystery, and even a touch of romance, creating a novel that is both a thrilling page-turner and a deeply introspective exploration of morality and forgiveness. As the four self-proclaimed 'vagabonds' make their way down the Mississippi River, they encounter a diverse cast of characters—struggling farmers, traveling faith healers, displaced families, and lost souls, each of whom leaves a mark on their journey. Yet, danger looms behind them and keeps them on the move as the ruthless Brinkmans, who run the school, are determined to retrieve Emmy at all costs.

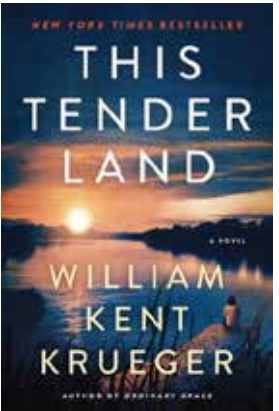
The novel vividly captures the historical struggles of the 1930s, as many characters in the book struggle through bankruptcies,

homelessness, and forced migration in hopes of a better future. The book also showcases the cultural beliefs of the time, such as the allure of traveling revival shows promising healing and prosperity, and the presence of Native American boarding schools. However, the crux of the book is about self discovery and the inherent human desire for belonging. Each of the children carries unique strengths and inherent personal burdens; through this voyage, they discover what it is they are truly running from, as well as what they are ultimately searching for.

With themes of hope, survival, loyalty, and forgiveness, the novel had me reflecting on profound questions such as where do I feel I most belong and how to navigate and persevere in spite of past trials. Most profound of all, I am left pondering where I am harboring unforgiveness in my life, and how overcoming this can lead to personal freedom. As Odie reflects, "Of all that we're asked to give others in this life, the most difficult to offer may be forgiveness."

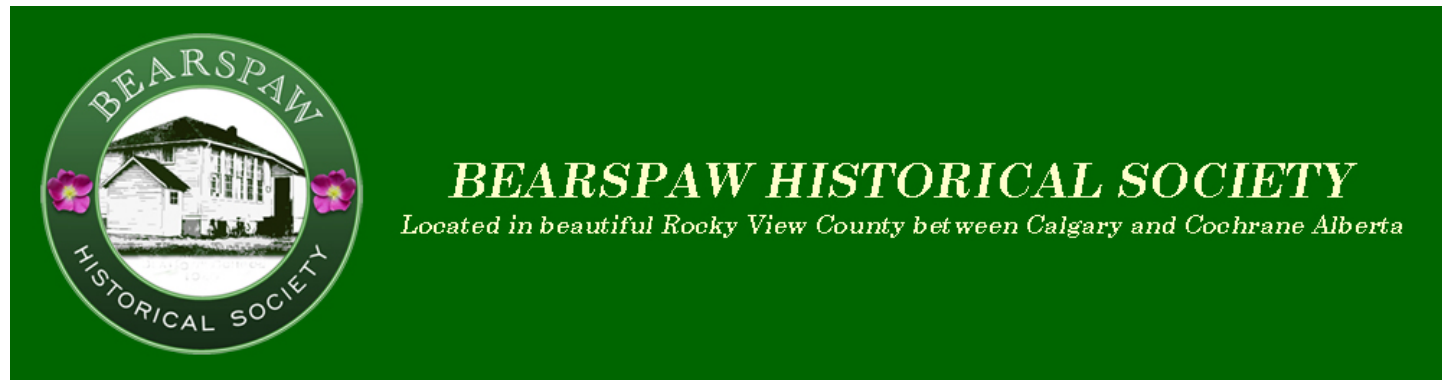

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A Journey of Trust: Reflections from Bears paw

Spread across my desk are years of memories- a collection of real estate advertisements that tell a story far beyond mere property listings. Each page represents a moment, a family, a home, and the incredible journey we've shared with the Bears paw community.

Recently, a long-time community member handed me this stack of ads, spanning back to 2009. As we sat together, discussing the sale of his family home, I was deeply moved. He'd been following our team's journey all these years, watching us grow, celebrating our successes, and ultimately choosing us to help transition this important chapter of his life.

It's humbling to realize how many stories we've been privileged to be part of.
