- 1. People who are less mobile may fear losing the homes they love or having to leave the communities they've lived in for years if they are unable to
 - keep their sidewalks clear. By removing snow for neighbours, you may be able to help them feel secure staying in their homes.
- 2. Paramedics experience a dramatic increase in heartrelated calls after heavy snowfalls. Cold air and heavy lifting can cause strain on the heart which leads to cardiac distress, especially for the elderly or those with physical ailments.
- 3. Social isolation can contribute to a low quality of life. For some, daily interactions with Snow Angels provide a source of community inclusion and pride.
- 4. Neighbours who know each other are less likely to be victims of crime as people look out for those they know.

Remember residents have just 24 hours after a snow fall to remove snow from sidewalks adjacent to their property.

Varsity Community Association Civic Affairs Report

Cannabis Store at Crowchild Square

An application for a cannabis store at Crowchild Square (in the old Digital Stop location) was refused by the City's Planning Department. The owner appealed this refusal to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. The Varsity Community Association appeared at the hearing opposing the appeal based on numerous planning criteria including inadequate parking, poor access, isolated location, and two relaxations of required separation distances - one to another cannabis store in Dalhousie Station and one to a child care facility. The Board overturned the decision and granted a development permit for the cannabis store.

Market Mall Redesignation

In June, Cadillac Fairview Market Mall applied for a land use redesignation which proposes an increase in Floor Area Ratio (FAR) from 0.46 to 0.53. This will add 150,000 square feet of Gross Leasable Area (GLA) to the mall. We will provide updates as they become available.

Varsity Ravine Park

New identification signs have been installed at Varsity Ravine Park, the linear park running south of Crowchild Trail to 53rd Street N.W. in the gully. This is an important, heavily used park that includes two playgrounds, a community garden, toboggan hill, offleash area, and bicycle and pedestrian pathway. A request to name this park and install signage was made in 2013. Approval was subsequently granted for the name and the signage is now in place.

From the 1970's to the 1990's, Varsity residents along with Alderman Pat Donnelly and Alderman Dale Hodges fought to preserve and enhance this park which has become a treasured amenity in the community.

Wing Gee, a local resident, has spearheaded another great initiative for the park. He is organizing custom-made vinyl wraps for the trash bins in the park. We'll give updates on this park enhancement in future articles.

Fire Station Redevelopment - 32nd Avenue

The City of Calgary has provided the following update:

"Varsity Multi-Service Redevelopment Project Update – October 2018

Thank you to everyone who participated in the engagement sessions held earlier this year regarding the Varsity Multi-Service Redevelopment.

The feedback received at the engagement sessions extended beyond the land use redesignation to include many aspects of this project, including design. As a result, The City has made the decision to submit the land use redesignation application, originally planned for spring/summer 2018, at the same time as the development permit, anticipated for 2019. Submitting the land use redesignation with the development permit will ensure the feedback received earlier this year as well as from the next phase of engagement can be incorporated into both applications.

We are now entering the design phase of the project. During the design phase, key considerations that will inform the design of the facility will be collected and explored, including site and zoning requirements, building design options, cost and stakeholder input. The design team has been selected for the project and we are currently in the process of planning upcoming engagement opportunities. More information will be provided once the engagement dates and details have been confirmed.
